

Guidelines for Online Registration of NTU Students in the Summer Session 1 for Academic Year 2025/2026

(Course offering will be dependent upon sufficient registration.)

I. Limitations on enrollment of NTU students in summer sessions:

1. NTU students who are forced to withdraw from the University during the second semester of the academic year may not register for summer sessions.
2. Students may take up to 16 credits for courses in each summer session.

II. Application dates: April 30th (9 am) to May 6th (12 midnight), 2026

Class duration: Please refer to the NTU summer calendar for the academic year 2025/2026.

III. Course allocation after online registration:

1. Type 1 courses:

- (1) Such a course will be offered when at least 16 students register.
- (2) Such a course will not be offered when less than 16 students register. Under special circumstances, however, students may file a special application for course offerings.
- (3) Regulations on the minimum number of enrolled students required for Service Learning courses shall be subject to separate case-by-case approval.

2. Type 2 courses: Such a course will be offered only when at least 5 NTU students have registered.

3. Students will be notified of any courses made unavailable due to insufficient registration.

IV. Course registration procedure:

1. The following courses will meet the criteria for course offering. Therefore, online registration is not required. Please directly select any desired courses online by the deadline specified on the NTU summer calendar.

The courses are: [Calculus (1) & Calculus (3)], [Calculus 4 (Applications in Economics and Management)], [General Physics (a)(1)], [Organic Chemistry (b)(1)], [Biochemistry(b) (1)] or any courses made available by special request.

2. To select any of the following courses, please visit in person the office in charge of the course offering to complete the registration procedures by the deadline.

V. Reminder for online course registration:

1. The number of registered students only serves as a threshold to see if a course will be made available. For courses that meet the minimum number of registered students and are available for online course enrollment, students still have to enroll for courses online by visiting NTU Course Information for summer sessions.
2. Course allocation and blocking
For courses without special requirements and with limited seats, when students that register for the course outnumber the seats available, the placement of the enrolled students will be carried out based on their year of college and order of course preference. The allocation based on year of college will go by the following order:
 - (1) Senior undergraduate students, as well as postgraduate students in their second year or above.
 - (2) Junior undergraduate students, as well as postgraduate students in their first year
 - (3) Sophomore students
 - (4) Freshmen
If the registered students still outnumber the seats available within the same priority group, the system will pick students at random.
