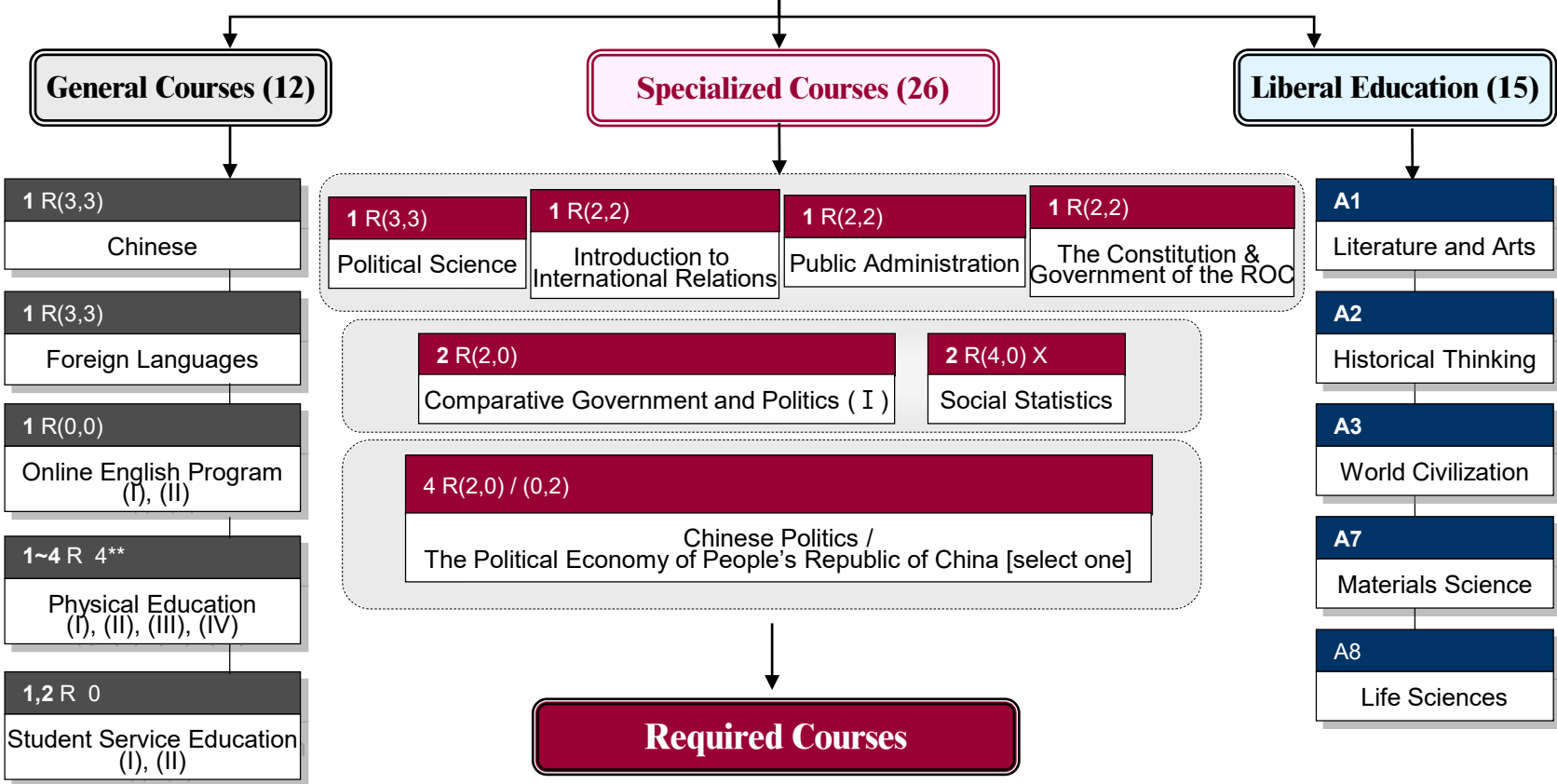

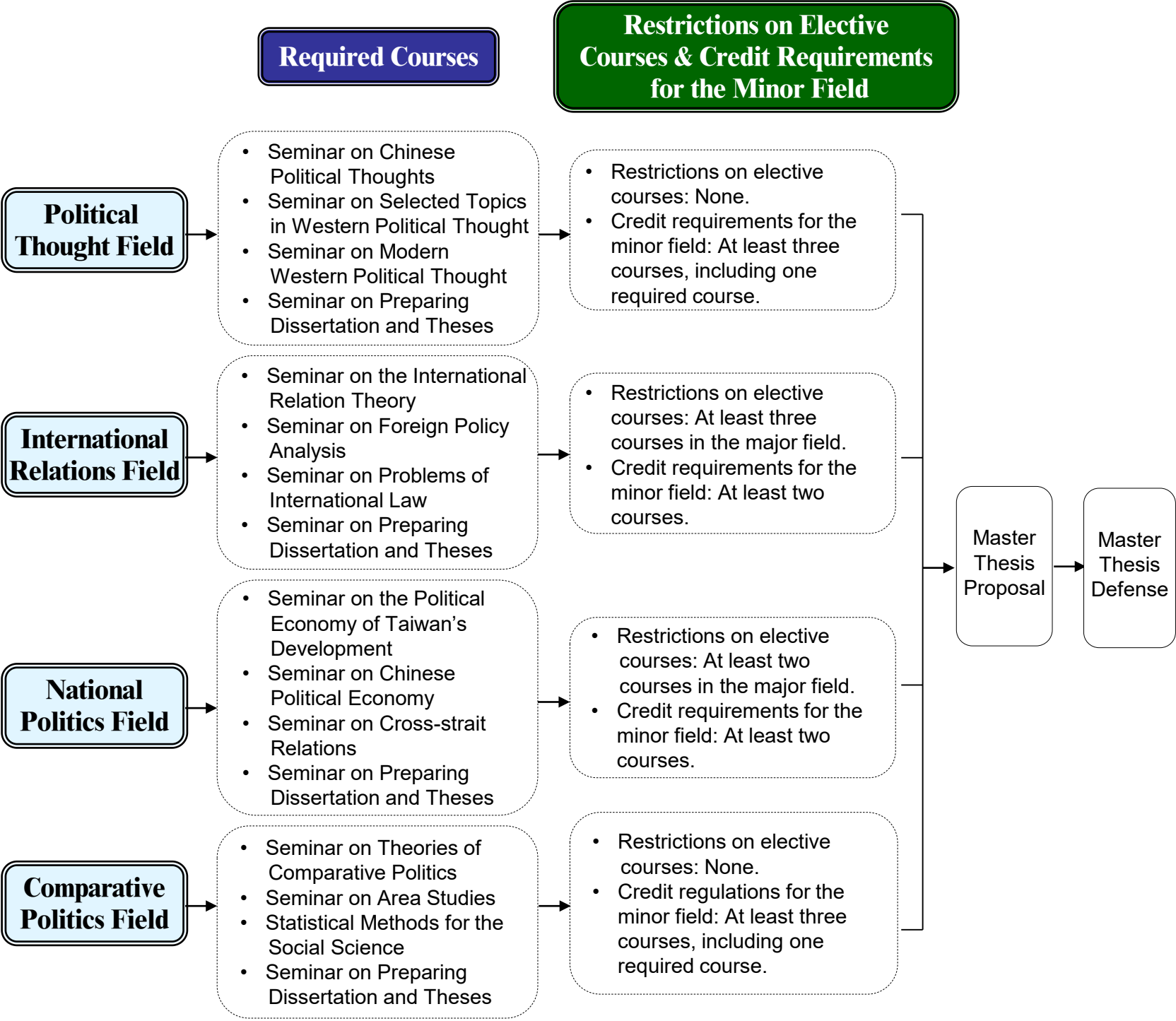

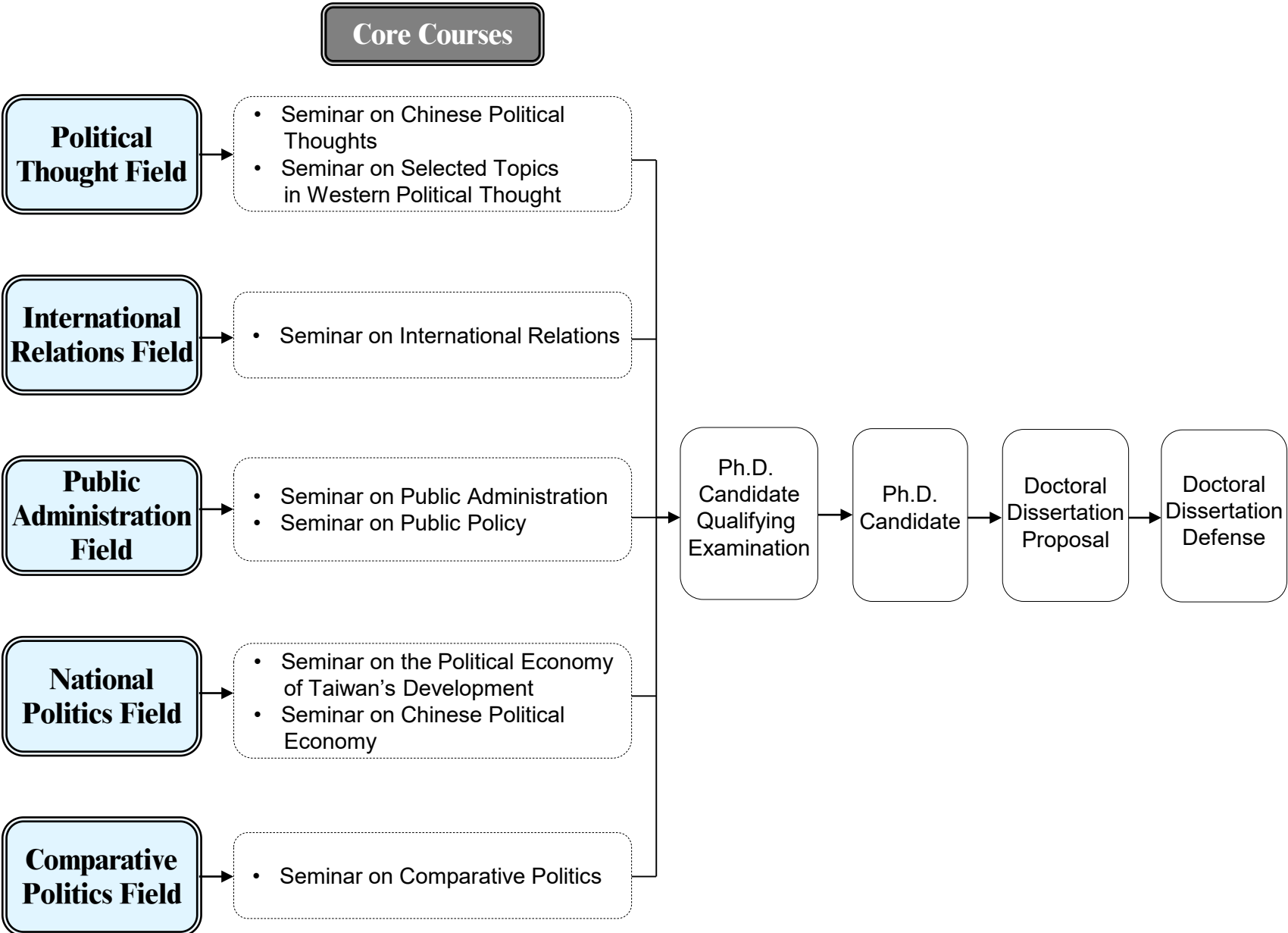
Master's Program Course Map - Graduate Institute of Political Science



Master's students should take related courses in the major and minor fields.
 Minimum graduation credits for each major field are: 25 credits for the political thought field; 25 credits for the international relations field; 25 credits for the national politics field; 26 credits for the comparative politics field.
 Students majoring in the international relations field are required to complete 6 credits of a second foreign language, which will not be counted toward graduation credits.
 Required courses for each major field and credit requirements for the minor field are as shown above.

- 1) PhD students are required to take core courses in the major field and at least one core course in the minor field. Each student is required to take at least four courses in their major field, including at least two doctoral courses (course number beginning with D). For the minor field, students are required to take at least two courses, including at least one doctoral course (course number beginning with D). Minimum graduation credits for PhD students are 18 credits.
- 2) Before applying for the oral defense, students must satisfy the following criteria:
 - I. Present at least one research paper at a domestic or foreign conference.
 - II. Publish at least one article in an SSCI or TSSCI journal (as a single author or as the first author), or publish at least two peer-reviewed journal articles or book chapters (as a single author or as the first author), or publish a peer-reviewed book.
